- Those who are pursuing the Creative Writing emphasis are encouraged to take the prerequisite course (ENL 5F, 5NF, or 5P) if not already completed at a transfer institution and/or apply to an ENL 100 creative writing workshop their first quarter

### Did you come under IGETC?

If so, please make sure you have your IGETC submitted to UC Davis (College of Letters & science Dean's Office Undergraduate Education Advising) and follow-up to make sure they received it.

**IGETC certified students need to meet the following requirements beyond meeting Major requirements:**

- Satisfy Upper Division Composition Requirement (Exam or completion of one course from UWP 101, or any of the 102's or 104's)
- Completion of 64 upper division units --- 44 upper division units come from completing the English Major
- Complete 180 units

## Recommended First Year Goals

- Confirm with your Major Advisor about how any transfer coursework will apply to your major and/or degree requirements

Area of Emphasis: **Literature, Criticism, & Theory** **12**

**One** upper division English elective: 4

(An upper division English elective refers to ANY 100 level English class of your choosing, beyond that which you are taking to fulfill other requirements for the Major.)

**Two** advanced studies courses, one of which can be a Seminar (S): 8

(Please note that 110A or 110B is a prerequisite for meeting this requirement)

Area of Emphasis: **Creative Writing** **12**

Three upper division English creative writing workshops chosen from: 12

English 100F, 100FA, 100NF, 100P, 100PA

- The prerequisite for any of the 100 level creative writing workshops is to take at least one course from ENL 5F, 5NF, 5P
- All workshops are repeatable for credit (ie, ENL 100P can be taken more than once towards the emphasis)
- To complete the emphasis, students must select courses in more than one genre
- ENL 100 level creative writing workshops are by application
